

Patient numbers have continued to increase in 2023 with a 3.5% rise from 2022, an increase from 1246 patients to 1289 patients. The numbers now mean that the service is transporting, on average, 106 patients each month.



It's been an exciting and busy year with the departure of our Beechcraft C90B King Air, which has faithfully served the Nelson base for the past 11 years, and the introduction of another Beechcraft B200 aircraft to replace it. As the newest aeromedical King Air in New Zealand, it has been fully upgraded and refurbished with a medical interior to allow more capability and speed over its predecessor. This will allow us to standardise our operational model and fleet, which brings many benefits for us all..

With the introduction of the new aircraft the Nelson team has also expanded from four pilots to five and finally allows us to operate a two-pilot model. During the year we also saw three more pilots join the ranks in Christchurch, which has kept the training team busy completing all the required training elements and supervision as they settle into their new roles as aeromedical pilots.

There have been various challenges during the year as the worldwide supply chain comes out of its Covid-19 recession. The delays in delivery of critical parts and shipping from various parts of the world all began to improve towards the end of the year.

We all look forward to 2024 as it's going to be a great year.

SIMULATOR

The King Air simulator is now fully installed and operational at the Christchurch base, giving the NZ Flying Doctor pilots the ability to train without leaving the ground.

This is a huge asset to the service and will be beneficial for both costs and sustainability.



ADTEC COMMUNICATION PROJECT

This project will improve the coordination of all the communication involved in the process of mapping out the best care for a patient. Currently a manual process, the trial will involve a technology solution that enables greater visibility across the team, coordination of schedules, and multi-calling to share information. This trial will go ahead thanks to a grant from ARCS. We look forward to bringing you updates on this as the project progresses through 2024.

ADELAIDE CONFERENCE

Having the ability to travel to conferences is a useful learning tool for the NZ Flying Doctor team. In 2023 a group of flight nurses attended the aeromedical conference in Adelaide and learnt about a range of topics, from developing resilience to electronic health records. FUTURE PLANS



MISSION - 2026: A PROJECT TO INCREASE CAPACITY AND CAPABILITY, AND ULTIMATELY SAVE MORE LIVES - THE STANDARDISATION AND MODERNISATION OF THE FLEET.


In Q1 2024 FDT will be brought into the fleet. Based out of Nelson, it is a Beechcraft King Air B200, the plane of choice for air retrievals. The goal is to build up to operating five King Air NZ Flying Doctor planes through acquisition. Harmonisation of the fleet will lead to standardised airframes and medical fitouts. This in turn will lead to better, more equitable aeromedical services for our community and improved availability. Tangible benefits include improved coverage in terms of geography, time of day, weather conditions and the ability to respond to the breadth of missions, requests such as supporting rural GP's and medical centres, inter-hospital transfers and bariatric patient transfers.

SUSTAINABILITY GOING FORWARD


Working in the field of aviation is challenging, especially as an emergency service but we are working to support the operator, GCH Aviation, in this area. Recent projects have included:- the introduction of the new King Air Simulator – this will significantly reduce travel to an overseas simulator and fuel/emissions with reduced air time; the addition of winglets to improve aerodynamics and LED lighting on the planes. Future projects include the introduction of solar panels at the base.

As the demand for our services steadily increases year-on-year and our team gets busier, we appreciate the community's help and support.
